Problem Statement

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1. Traditional methods for training new Planning Council members were costly, date/time/venue bound and inconsistently attended
2. Needed to develop a New Member Training that was low-cost, accessible 24/7 and facilitated participation by all

Previous Trainings

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1. Large group facilitated New Member Orientation (strongly suggested but not mandatory, one-day training)
2. Small group facilitated topic-specific trainings (strongly suggested but not mandatory, one-day and two-day trainings)

Previous Trainings

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Facilitated, date/time/venue specific, large and small group New Member Orientation and Trainings proved, in and of themselves, to be:

- Inconvenient – not all members could fit their schedule to the dates/times orientation/training was offered
- Expensive – costs for trainers, facilities, materials, etc.
- Pace – trainings too slow or fast for some participants, not tailored to individual needs

Vision

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Development of a web-based, audio-assisted system where new Planning Council members could access trainings at their own pace

- Provides basic content consistently over time
- Utilizes visual analytics to monitor training progress
- Certifies completion of trainings
- Provides a better training opportunity by meeting members “where they are”

Current Training

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1. Large group face-to-face New Member Orientation (half-day, mandatory, cannot assume seat on Council unless taken)
2. Assigned a Mentor as a Planning Council navigator (mandatory)
3. Online web-based trainings (three trainings, mandatory, can not vote until completed)
4. Small group face-to-face training (full day, optional but strongly suggested during first year of service)

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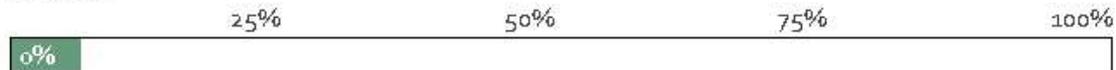

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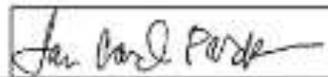

Development Process

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- Council identified training needs and approved cost of web-based training
- Council contracted with RDE to develop platform to host web-based trainings
- RDE worked with Council staff to establish a timeline of deliverables
- RDE provided Council with demonstrations as platform was being developed
- Council staff created content in PowerPoint and contracted with a consultant to turn into Articulate Presenter-based interactive trainings
- RDE posted content, trained Council staff on administration (monitoring progress, using visual analytics)

Challenges

- Council approval for concept and costs
- Mandating trainings
- Identifying in-house expertise and outside consultants
- Creating content for trainings
- Turning content into interactive trainings
- Creating web-based platform for hosting trainings
- Acknowledging that not everyone has computer access or skills, need to provide community-based access and computer assistance

Technical Issues

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“ **Challenge:** Biggest challenge for Council staff was to turn a PowerPoint into an interactive audio-assisted training.

“ **Solution:** We solved this by hiring a consultant who knew Articulate Presenter software.

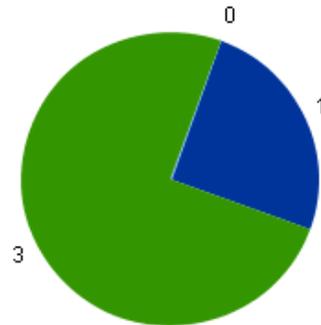
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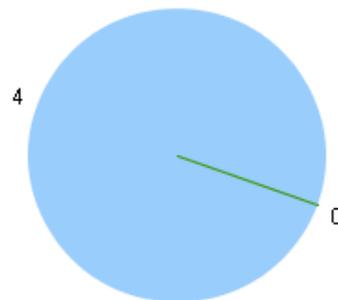

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Outcomes

Online Training

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Advantage of online trainings

- Available whenever members can utilize
- Accessible from home, office, mobile device
- Provide consistent content with ability to update
- Reduce cost of face-to-face trainings
- Low cost maintenance
- Offer ability to monitor and track trainees' progress in real time
- Offer certification -- passing score on all training modules prerequisite for voting privileges

Online Training Feedback

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New Council Members have noted:

- “ A good review and complement to the Orientation. It was easy to use, didn't take too long and was kind of fun.
- “ Very complete, covering a lot of territory.
- “ Informative and helpful to my new role.
- “ Strengthened my commitment to be a member.
- “ Helpful and easy to use.

Future

- Revise and add trainings to maintain currency
 - Update annually
- Scale up
 - Require all community participants who sit on Council committees to take trainings
- Retain Council members' engagement
 - Continue to offer topic-specific small group trainings (e.g. priority setting & resource allocation process)

Lessons Learned

- ✓ Must have Council support – find a few key champions
- ✓ Commit to using a web-based architecture to minimize management & maintenance headaches and costs
- ✓ Keep content simple and training short
- ✓ Allow for the cost of changes
- ✓ Anticipate ongoing cost of maintenance
- ✓ Online training can be an excellent supplement to other training activities

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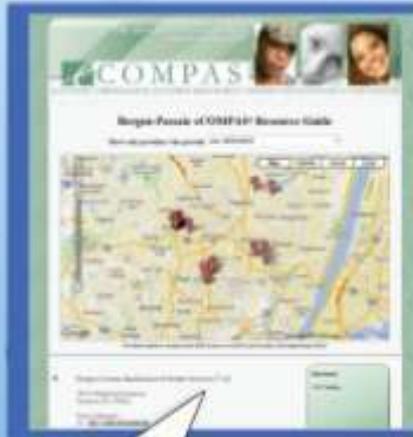
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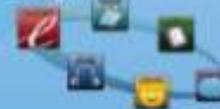
